Auch Geschenkpapier kann recycelt werden

Damit das Altpapier sortierbar bleibt – Tipps für den Morgen nach Weihnachten

Weihnachten bedeutet eine Flut kleiner und großer Aufmerksamkeiten, aber auch eine Flut von Verpackungen. Was in der Altpapiertonne landet, muss nach einer maschinellen Vorsortierung zum Schluss **von Hand** wieder aus-einandersortiert werden – zumindest dann, wenn aus dem Altpapier wieder Papier für neue Zeitungen werden soll. Die braunen und grauen Fasern im Karton können beim Recycling nämlich nicht

in weiße Fasern verwandelt werden.

Deshalb trennen sich hier die Wege: Weißes Papier geht in die Papierfabriken, um daraus wieder Zeitungspapier herzustellen. Ein Gemisch aus weißem Papier und braunem Karton wird von Kartonfabriken verwertet.

Und so kann die Flut der Verpackungen besser sortiert und verwertet werden:

- **Geschenkpapier möglichst nicht zerknüllen**, sondern flach ins Altpapier legen
- Schnüre, Bänder und Aufkleber entfernen

- Klebstreifen und Selbstklebeetiketten nach Möglichkeit entfernen (Reste von Klebstoffen stören die Papierherstellung)

- Verwenden Sie deshalb für Ihre Weihnachtspost möglichst nur nassklebende und keine selbstklebenden Umschläge
- Kein mit Lebensmittelresten (z.B. Schokolade) verunreinigtes Papier ins Altpapier
- Kartons möglichst nur zusammenlegen, nicht in kleine Stücke zerreißen (das erleichtert das Sortieren sowohl maschinell wie auch von Hand).

Even Gift Wrapping Paper Can be Recycled

Keep Paper for Recycling Easy to Sort – Tips for the Morning after Christmas



Christmas means a flood of small and large gifts, but also a flood of packaging. What ends up in the paper bin, must be

sorted and separated. First by a mechanical pre-sorting, concluded by hand – at least if the recycled paper will be used for new newspapers again. The brown

This is why the two fractions go separate ways from here: White paper goes into the paper mills to produce newspaper from it. A mixture of white paper and brown cardboard is recycled by board mills to produce new boxes and cartons.

This is how the flood of packaging can be better sorted and recycled:

- As far as possible, do not crumple gift wrapping, but lay it flat into the paper bin for recycling
- Remove cords, ribbons and stickers
- If possible remove adhesive tape and adhesive labels (residues of adhesives disturb the papermaking)
- For your Christmas mail if possible prefer wet bonding and avoid self-adhesive envelopes
- No paper with food residues (e. g., chocolate or pizza) into the paper for recycling
- Just fold large carton boxes, do not tear them into small pieces (this facilitates both mechanical as well as hand sorting).
